
Lesson 8 - Food & Drinks (Part 2)

Welcome to lesson 8! This week, we are going to continue with food and drinks. We covered most of the words related to food in the previous lesson, but we have some more to learn here in this lesson. After that, we'll move onto drinks. With that, let's get started!

Meat & Seafood

As you can see, the different types of meat each have the animal name followed by the word $\exists 7$, which makes them super easy to remember. This also applies to most other dishes that involve a type of animal.

One thing you should know if you are visiting Korea is that eating meat is a big thing here. Barbeque restaurants are all over and if you are a vegetarian or vegan, you may have a hard time finding food options.

If you're travelling to Seoul, your options will be much better as more and more people have been asking for options other than meat. Here are some helpful phrases for those of you that do not eat meat or other animal products.


Let's also talk about the word 생선. You may have heard the word 물고기 for fish.

Both are correct in referring to fish, however there is a slight difference. 생선 refers to

fish that has been prepared for eating. $\exists \exists \exists \exists \exists$ is used for fish that are alive and swimming about. It's a common mistake to use $\exists \exists \exists \exists$ when referring to cooked meals involving fish, and although most Korean will just find it to be a cute mistake, it's always best to use the proper term!



There's lots of Konglish in the words above. Lots of food that has become popular here in Korea was introduced from other countries so many names are still the same as in English which make these easy to learn and remember as well.




